



## **COVID-19: Screening Checklist for Visitors and Staff**

As areas of the country lift visitor restrictions, it is important to continue to screen anyone who enters the facility. Early identification of symptoms and possible exposure reduces the likelihood of spreading the virus. **ALL individuals** (staff, other health care workers, family, visitors, government officials, etc.) entering the building must be asked the following questions:

1.	. Has this individual washed their hands or used alcohol-based hand rub (ABHR) on entry?		
	☐ Yes ☐ No – please ask ther	n to do so	
2.	Ask the individual if they have any of the following respiratory symptoms?		
	☐ Shortness of breath or ☐ Head	oss of taste or smell	
	<ul> <li>If YES to any, ask if they have alternative diagnosis that may be causing the symptoms. If no alternative diagnosis, restrict them from entering the building.</li> <li>If NO to all, proceed to Step 3.</li> </ul>		
3.	If no to all, proceed to question #3. For Visitors, Staff, & Health Care Providers (HCP) (e.g. agency staff, regional or corporate staff, health care workers such as hospice, EMS, dialysis technicians that provide care to residents):		
	3A. Check temperature and document results:		
	<ul> <li>If YES, restrict from entering the building.</li> <li>If NO, visitors proceed to step 4; staff and HCP proceed to step 3B.</li> </ul>		
	3B. For Staff & HCP - Ask if they have worked in facilities or locations with recognized COVID-19 cases?		
	☐ If YES, ask if they worked with a person(s) with confirmed COVID-19?		
	<ul> <li>If YES, require them to wear PPE including mask, gloves, gown before any contact with residents &amp; proceed to step 4.</li> <li>If NO, proceed to step 4.</li> </ul>		
4.	l. Allow entry to building and remind the individual to:		
	<ul> <li>Wash their hands or use ABHR throughout their time in the building.</li> <li>Not shake hands with, touch or hug individuals during their visit.</li> </ul>

	Must wear a facemask while in the building and social distance.	When there are cases in the community but none in this facility:  ☐ Consider implementing universal use of facemasks for all HCP while in this facility.  When there are cases in this facility OR sustained transmission in the community:  ☐ Implement universal use of facemask for all HCP while in this facility.  ☐ Consider having HCP wear all recommended PPE (gown, gloves, eye protection, N95 respirator or, if not available, a facemask) for the care of all residents, regardless of presence of symptoms. Implement protocols for extended use of eye protection & facemasks.
