About the Movies

In **The Sandwich Generation**, a filmmaker-photographer couple talk about being part of the twenty million Americans who face the shifting and challenging responsibilities as well as unexpected joys of being in the middle of caring for both their children and their aging parents.

Seesawing between concerned experts and moving case histories, **Last Will and Embezzlement** introduces us to criminals who exploit the vulnerabilities of dementia, illness or isolation of the elderly, insinuating themselves into their finances and wreaking havoc on their lives.

In an age where so much effort seems to be made to distance ourselves from death, the documentary **203 Days** highlights the closeness that can be brought within one family despite the stress of family conflicts as they face the death of their matriarch.

An Ordinary Life profiles an extraordinary 82 year old woman who experiences life to the fullest, as an anti-war and environmental activist who laughs off the difficulties of going to jail for a cause, dances with abandon, bicycles around her hometown and creates artwork with the depth of nature.
